Hope you were able to welcome Pat and Lionel back home, thankfully there was reasonable media coverage.

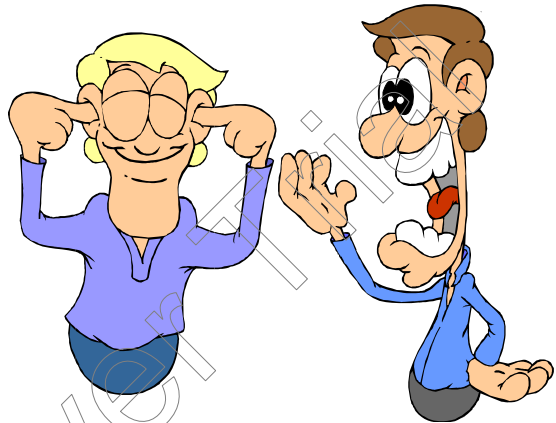
Here's hoping we can have them to a club meeting to recount some of their experiences.
